The City of McLeansboro Gas Utility is hereby giving notice to all our customers who have buried natural gas piping, *which is not maintained by the gas utility*, of important information posted on the backside of this newsletter. Please read the information, and phone us with any questions.

Republic Garbage Services will run without interruption of services this month. Please put your totes out the evening before pick-up and remove them from street-side as soon as possible following pick-up. **All trash should be bagged and inside the tote. Republic is not required to accept additional bags of trash at curb-side.**

Yard Chores. Clean and well-kept yards make for happy neighbors, fewer mosquitoes, and good curbside appeal. Please do not send your grass clippings into City streets. The Street Department can assist with clean-up after storms, but please be responsible for managing your own yard waste. City Code provides for burning yard waste on private property (not City streets).

Rules to remember: Do not fill yard bags with more than 40 pounds of waste, all branches should be cut to less than 5 feet in length, no more than 3 inches in diameter and stacked for easy pick-up. The property owner is responsible for mowing his/her ditch and/or half of the alley. Spring gives us another chance to do it right.

NOTICE: The City is not responsible for mail delivery. Failure to receive billing does not relinquish responsibility for payment or penalty. Payment for utilities is always due on the 10th of the month. Any utility bills not paid by 4:00 P.M. on Friday, June 16 will result in the customer having services stopped on Monday, June 19. A reconnect fee of \$25.00 will be charged. Customers are responsible for all costs requiring collection.
